



The eligibility screening is how Health Brigade can find out if you are able to receive free health care at our clinic. To see if you are able to receive health care here at our free clinic, Health Brigade asks for proof of <u>all</u> money you and your family members make.

Please look at what counts as money earned, income, and what proof of income you need to bring to your eligibility screening. These documents must be brought with you to your screening appointment.
